In 2022, the (in)stable project, enriched by the collaboration with anthropologist Alice Hertzog, will continue to develop these themes. The participants are delighted to be involved in a Bottom Théâtre club once again. Since their arrival in France, the existence of this club has enabled them to forge links, develop their language skills and integrate. The link with the Bottom partner has enabled them to access a work-linked training scheme. Two young migrants found jobs and went on to training leading





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to qualifications, thanks to the commitment of the club's team. In addition, three other young French intermittents are now employed by the club to create this work of theatre.

The club's strength lies in the diverse backgrounds of its members.

Laba's involvement in the Youth Club has helped to forge links between people by organising get-to-know-you workshops at the start and end of each session. The members of the club admit that they hadn't taken the time to discuss their backgrounds and that these workshops enabled them to discover each other in a different light.

 - The young people in the group are employed, but they are in a precarious situation (3 casual workers and two part-time workers);
 - The target group is faced with a precarious professional future and a lack of inclusion in France because of their origins. Their strength lies in their willingness to integrate and seize the opportunities available in France but not in their country of origin.
 What's more, the different backgrounds of the participants help to create a bond and a unique piece of theatre. The experience of the 2 professional actors gives the group energy.
